To ensure a Safe Environment, Respect for Self and Others, Educational Excellence, and a firm commitment in promoting the teachers ability to teach and all students in learning, the following system of progressive discipline was developed to support student achievement and Tahquitz P.R.I.D.E.

Note: All Rapid Exit Offenses are Immediately Sent to Administration. If not Rapid Exit, proceed as follows:

Tahquitz Progressive Discipline Grid 2014-2015

Step One: After or up to four in-class interventions/consequences for the semester (documented in teacher binder). Teacher Managed	Possible Outcomes: Verbal redirections/warning, reflection form, change in seating, loss of participation points, mandatory Parent/Teacher conference or phone call.
Step Two: Fifth in –class intervention / consequence for the semester (send referral to office with documentation from teacher binder). Dress Code

Students may not wear, display, nor be in possession of the following items:

- 1. **Spiked jewelry** (i.e. earrings, necklaces, collars, hair pieces) of any kind.
- 2. Chains or chokers.
- 3. **Overly brief or tight garments** (i.e. halter-tops, tube tops or muscle shirts, spaghetti straps, strapless, off the shoulder, or fishnet see through garments).
- 4. Sleepwear (i.e. pajama pants) of any kind.
- 5. **Oversized, sagged or baggy pants, and belt buckles lettered or numbered** are not permitted. Oversized belts hanging from under apparel shall not be worn.
- 6. **Professional sports team gear** (i.e. hats, caps, beanies, hairnets, bandannas, head coverings or other gang affiliated headgear/apparel).
- 7. No hat will be worn inside buildings. Hoods will not be worn as except on rainy days.
- 8. **Clothing that is unsafe, lewd, indecent, vulgar, and obscene or gang related**, nor shall the clothing disrupt the educational process or the orderly operation of the school. Student dress shall not display emblems, lettering or pictures pertaining to gang, drug, tobacco, alcohol, sex, death, mutilation, violence or a gang's "silent code."
- Clothing, jewelry and personal items (i.e. backpacks, fanny packs, gym bags, water bottles etc.) with writing, pictures or any other insignia which are crude, vulgar, profane or sexually suggestive, which bear drug, alcohol or tobacco advertising, promotions and likenesses, or which advocate gender, racial, ethnic, or religious prejudice.
- 10. Any clothing considered by the administration or law enforcement agencies to be gang related is not to be worn.

Positive Behavior: California Education Code

Education Code 48900:

A pupil shall not be suspended from school or recommended for expulsion, unless the superintendent of the school district or the principal of the school in which the pupil is enrolled determines that the pupil has committed an act as defined pursuant to any of subdivisions (a) to (s):

- (a)(1) Caused, attempted to cause, or threatened to cause physical injury to another person.
- (a)(2) Willfully used force or violence upon the person of another, except in self-defense.
- (b) Possessed, sold, or otherwise furnished a firearm, knife, explosive, or other dangerous object.
- (c) Unlawfully possessed, used, sold, or otherwise furnished, or been under the influence of, a controlled substance or alcoholic beverage or intoxicant.
- (d) Unlawfully offered, arranged, or negotiated to sell a controlled substance, alcoholic beverage, or intox icant.
- (e) Committed or attempted to commit robbery or extortion.
- (f) Caused or attempted to cause damage to school or private property.
- (g) Stole or attempted to steal school or private property.
- (h) Possessed or used tobacco, or products containing tobacco or nicotine products, including but not lim ited to cigarettes, cigars, miniature cigars, clove cigarettes, snuff, chew packets, and betel. *Hookah pens included.
- (i) Committed an obscene act or engaged in habitual profanity or vulgarity.
- (j) Unlawfully possessed or unlawfully offered, or negotiated to sell drug paraphernalia
- (k) Disrupted school activities or otherwise willfully defied the valid authority of supervisors, teachers, ad ministrators, school officials, or other school personnel engaged in the performance of their duties.
- (I) Knowingly received stolen school property or private property.
- (m) Possessed an imitation firearm.
- (n) Committed or attempted to commit a sexual assault or battery.
- (o) Harassed, threatened, or intimidated a pupil who is a complaining witness or a witness in a school dis ciplinary proceeding for purposes of either preventing that pupil from being a witness or retaliating against that pupil for being a witness, or both.
- (p) Unlawfully offered, arranged to sell, negotiated to sell, or sold the prescription drug Soma.
- (q) Engaged in, or attempted to engage in, hazing in physical or mental harm to a former, current, or prospective pupil.
- (r) Engaged in an act of bullying, which is defined as any severe or pervasive physical or verbal act or conduct, including communications made in writing or by means of an electronic act, and including one or more acts committed by a pupil or group of pupils:
 - (A) Placing a reasonable pupil or pupils in fear of harm to that pupil's or those pupils' person or proper tv.
 - (B) Causing a reasonable pupil to experience a substantially detrimental effect on his or her physical or mental health.
 - (C) Causing a reasonable pupil to experience substantial interference with his or her academic performance.
 - (D) Causing a reasonable pupil to experience substantial interference with his or her ability to participate in or benefit from the services, activities, or privileges provided by a school.
- (s) Aiding or abetting the infliction or attempted infliction of physical injury on another person.
- 48900.2 Committed sexual harassment.
- 48900.3 Caused, attempted to cause, or participated in hate violence.
- 48900.4 Created an intimidating or hostile educational environment by intentionally engaging in harass ment, threats, or intimidation against a pupil or group of pupils.
- 48900.7 Terroristic threats against school officials or school property, or both.
